

WHAT IS TOURETTE SYNDROME?



Tourette Syndrome is...

- A neurological, genetic condition.
- A combination of involuntary motor and vocal tics.
- Tics usually start in childhood around the age of seven.
- 90 per cent of people with Tourette Syndrome (TS) are not compelled to swear.
- TS is a wide spectrum conditon.
- People with TS commonly have other conditions, especially ADHD and OCD.
- To be diagnosed with TS, a person must have had a combination of vocal and motor tics for at least one year.
- Referral to specialist neurologists for confirmation of diagnosis and management of TS is recommended.
- Management of tics include medication and behavioural therapy.
