

Tourettes Action Primary School Lesson Plan - KS3/4

The following lesson plan has been created to educate KS3/4 pupils about Tourette Syndrome (TS). The lesson starts with asking pupils what they know about Tourettes and then moves on to educate them, allowing them to take part in activities aimed at showing the students what having Tourettes can feel like. The lesson ends with a quiz and an activity producing an awareness poster to put around school to educate people further about TS.

Lesson Time: You will need to put aside 55 minutes to conduct this lesson.

Learning Intention/Objectives: This lesson aims to teach pupils about what Tourette Syndrome is and what it is not, how they can support pupils who have TS in the school and where they can go for help if they have other questions.

Outcome: By the end of the lesson we are hoping that pupils will have a greater understanding of Tourettes either by doing the quiz or creating an awareness poster about TS to display around school.

5 mins	Engage	Tell the class that in this lesson we are going to learn about a condition called Tourette Syndrome (TS).
		Ask the class if they have heard of TS before, what they think it is
		and if they know of anyone with TS?
15 mins	Explore	Tell the class we are now going to find out what TS is. Work
		through this presentation:
		A presentation for secondary school children
10 mins	Explain	Following the presentation, ask the students to share with the
		class what they have learned that they didn't know before and
		any new facts that surprised them. Discuss their thoughts on how
		the media/social media have previously portrayed TS and
		whether they can now dispel any misconceptions around TS.
20 mins	Extend	Ask students to complete the TS quiz here which will challenge
		their knowledge of TS:

		Ask the pupils to think about the facts they have learned about TS
		today and how important it is to spread awareness of TS and to
		educate others on the reality of this condition. Tell the students it
		is important that the school community know how to help people
		with TS. Ask them to design and create an awareness poster to
		display around school for others to learn more about this condition.
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5 mins	Elaborate	Ask students to share their posters and explain the intended
		message to the class. Showing that #ItsNotWhatYouThink
