Let's take a closer look at the story to see who's laughing and who's not!





"Try and make me laugh," said Chip.


- What does Biff do to try to make Chip laugh?

Biff tries again to make Chip laugh.


- Do you find Biff's outfit funny? Why?

- What object would you have brought to make Chip laugh?






Everyone is trying to win the competition to make the princess laugh.

 Look at each person in the queue. How do you think they are going to try to make the king laugh?


• Would anyone in the queue make you laugh? Why?
